

Classification

Gwen Harden and John Williams' inclusion of bacteria among Plants raised a few eyebrows as well as prompting the question "What is a plant anyway?" I haven't got to the bottom of that yet, but Andrew Beattie of Macquarie University in his book Wild Solutions writes of four kingdoms: plants, animals, fungi and bacteria. He goes on to comment that some think there are five kingdoms including protoctista which contains all not fitting into the first four named. Example: slime mould.

After kingdoms come phyla, whose members display a basic unique body plan. O


